Johnson's interest in the field of materials testing began during an internship with the Chicago-based company that would eventually become his own, continuing from his days as a student at

When Johnson and his partner Jeff Krozel purchased Material Service Testing from its retiring owner, there were five employees. Today, as a direct result of the firm's work on the Illinois Tollway's *Move Illinois* 

Program, the certified minority business enterprise has grown to include a staff of 45 employees providing a comprehensive range of services from on-site field inspection and pavement materials testing to complete

laboratory testing and engineering services. Forty percent of Material Service Testing's workforce is directly involved with *Move Illinois* projects, Johnson said.

2014 was the biggest year

for the company since its founding. With continuing multi-year contracts and anticipated future growth, 2015 is proving to be even more prosperous with work scheduled on the Elgin O'Hare Western Access Project, the Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90) Rebuilding and Widening Project, the Orland Grasslands South Preserve wetland mitigation project, as well as other projects throughout the Tollway system.
